Creative cloud photoshop cc

Photoshop now comes with Adobe Creative Cloud along with other applications like InDesign and Adobe Bridge. While the interface has changed over the years, Photoshop remains one of the most powerful image editing tools available. The information in this article applies to the desktop version of Adobe Photoshop CC 2019 for Windows and Mac. When you open an image or create a new document in Photoshop, you'll be taken to the workspace. The interface can be customized, but the default layout consists of four main parts: The Main Task Line, Tool options, toolbox, Palettes. If you need help finding a specific tool or panel, select the magnifying glass in the upper-right corner to search for it. You also have the option to download free graphical assets from Adobe. To reset Photoshop settings back to their default settings, hold down Ctrl + Alt + Shift (on Windows) or Command + Option + Shift (on Mac) immediately after launching Photoshop. The main task bar consists of nine menus: File, Edit, Picture, Layer, Type, Select, Filter, 3D, View, Window, and Help. If a menu command is followed by ellipses (...), a dialog box opens if you select a dialog box. For example, when you choose File > Place Embedded, you are prompted to select a different image to embed in the current workspace. The tool options are where you want to go to adjust the settings for the active tool. This toolbar is contextual, which means it changes according to the tool you've selected. For example, when the Text tool is active, you can adjust the size, font, and alignment of the text. The icons on the left side of the workspace represent the tools you need to work with. Select the arrows at the top of the toolbar (under the Home icon) to expand the toolbar so you can see all your options. Hold down the mouse button while you click each icon to display a multi-tool submenu. Select the ellipses (...) at the bottom of the toolbar to customize the settings, save different presets, and even change keyboard shortcuts. Some tools share the same keyboard shortcut. For example, rectangle marking and elliptical markings are assigned to the M key. To switch between them, press Shift + M. Select the colored squares near the bottom of the toolbox to set the foreground and background colors. The foreground color is used when painting, filling, and stroke selection. The background color is used when creating gradient fills, fills in the deleted areas of an image, and when you expand the canvas. Foreground and background colors are also used by some special effects filters. Click and hold the screen mode icon in the lower-right corner of the toolbar to change the look of the workspace. Press the F key to switch between all three modes. When you're in full-screen mode, you can turn the menu bar on and off with the Shift + F shortcut. You can also turn the toolbar, status bar, and palettes on and off with the Tab key, you just want to hide palettes and and toolbox displayed, use Shift + Tab. On the right side of Photoshop, you'll see the palette well and more extended palette panels. Individual palette groups can be moved around the workspace by clicking and dragging the title bar. Select the menu icon in the title bar area to see a list of additional options. Select Close Tab Group to hide the palette. If you don't see the palette you need, select Windows from the main task bar and select the desired palette. You can also split and rearrange the palettes by clicking a tab and dragging it outside the group or to another group. Some palettes can be changed by clicking and dragging the edges. Multiple palettes can be connected to a large super palette. To do this, click and drag a palette across the title bar of another palette, and then release the mouse button. When multiple palettes are grouped together, select the title tab for the palette you want to bring to the front of the group. You can attach multiple palettes this way to create a massive palette collection. This can be useful if you are using multiple monitors and you want to move all the palettes to another screen. By snapping all floating palettes together, you can then drag them all to the other screen in one click. Choose Window > Workspace > New Workspace to save the workspace settings. When you go to > in the workspace in the future, you'll see the new saved workspace at the top of the menu. To return the palettes to their default locations, go to > Workspace > Reset. The palette well is the vertical column with icons to the left of the floating palette panels. There is a place to keep palettes that you do not want to occupy the workspace. To move an open panel to the palette well, simply drag and drop the title bar into the column. You can then expand the palette by selecting the icon from the well. Select the arrows in the upper-right corner of the palette panels to hide the panels in a sidebar menu. If you open another document while in the Photoshop workspace, a new tab opens below the tools options bar. You can quickly switch between documents by clicking these categories. Below the image is the status bar, which displays different information about the current document. Select the arrow in the status bar to select what information to display. Adjust the zoom by selecting View from the menu bar, or using the Zoom tool. If you want the document window to change when you zoom in and out, select The Resize Windows to Customize box on the toolbar. Select Fit to Screen to make the entire image fit in the workspace. To zoom in and out without switching to the Zoom tool, hold down Ctrl (in Windows) or Command (on Mac) and press the plus and minus (+) keys (-).
